A fly with an extremely unusual ability to hear is the model for the future of new and improved hearing aids. The insect behaves in a 36 way. He lives on or in another kind of insect called a 37. This particular fly places smartly 38 onto a cricket (蟋蟀) host. They dig into the cricket and 39 the insect from the inside out.

The tiny yellow fly lives in the southern United States. It finds its host by 40 the cricket's high sharp voice. The fly can 41 find a cricket from as far away as 91 meters.

Neal Hall is a(n) 42 engineer who worked on the new hearing aid model. Mr. Hall and his team at the University of Texas made a 43 of the fly's hearing system.

The fly's ears are two millimeters 44. That distance is 45 small that sound reaches one ear just four millionths of a second 46 arriving at the other. Experts say it should be 47 to identify where a sound is coming from. 48 inside this fly's ear is a 1.5 millimeters long structure 49 to a see-saw (跷跷板) — a piece of children's party equipment.

Hall says the hearing aid device could be 50 in two ways. One way would be to help soldiers on the battle field; there, sensors could find where 51 are coming from. The second way would be to 52 unwanted noise from a person's surroundings.

Hall says the next test in 53 the hearing aid device is to make it usable. He says the device must be 54 cautiously because it is so small. But he notes that the 55 does not have this concern at all.

Lu Xin's mother fell pregnant when her son was 9 and a second child was forbidden under the family planning policy of the 1980s. Even though acting against the policy would mean Lu Zuyin, the father, would be dismissed from the Party and lose his job at a State-owned enterprise, the family was determined to keep the child.

“I'm an adopted child and I know how bitter it is to be abandoned. I won't let that happen to my child,” says Lu Zuyin, 60.

The happiness of having a son and a daughter after the girl was born rid the father of the pain of losing his job. However, the parents were desperate to discover their newborn daughter suffered from a congenital dislocation(先天性脱位) of the right knee.

“Nobody could promise success to cure my girl of this rare disease, but I didn’t want to give up. I would not leave the baby with any regrets even if I have to use up all I have to bet on her future,” says the father.

Lu clearly remembers her father taking her to one after another hospital to seek medical advice. “I couldn’t even walk when I was in kindergarten,” says Lu, who is now a 26-year-old free writer.

Some neighbors advised her father to abandon the child, a suggestion he firmly rejected. “She’s my precious daughter who I got after making sacrifices in work. Moreover, nobody would take her for medical treatment if they adopted her,” Lu Zuyin says.

After years of medical treatment, Lu Xin began to learn to walk at 6. Her father had spent all his savings and had debts of about 80,000 yuan.

“All my neighbors called me ‘Santana’ at that time because the car model had just been introduced to China and cost nearly 200,000 yuan,” says Lu, who can now run and jump just like anyone else.

In late October, international health officials began reporting some good news in the battle against Ebola, saying the number of new Ebola cases in West Africa is falling. But the experts warn this news must not slow the fight against Ebola, for it has appeared in the US. The United Nations is still calling for more international help to fight the deadly virus.

In Liberia’s capital, Anthony Banbury, a UN official, confirmed there have been improvements in the fight against the deadly disease. Fewer people are getting infected(感染) and fewer are dying from it. But he warns, the fight against Ebola is far from over.

In the United States, health officials have expressed hope that a new vaccine (疫苗) may protect against Ebola. The disease has already killed about 5,000 people and infected close to 14,000 others.

Lausanne’s University Hospital in Switzerland began testing their vaccine on Tuesday on healthy volunteers. A doctor who only gave her name as “Tina” agreed to take part in the study. She says a safe vaccine that works is needed to prevent the spread of Ebola. Meanwhile, Johnson & Johnson in America also is developing an Ebola vaccine, and so is Tekmira Pharmaceuticals Corp. of Canada. Before long, the NIH(美国全国卫生研究所) and its partners are to begin late-stage testing of Ebola virus, plus a second Ebola vaccine together developed by Britain’s GlaxoSmithKline PLC.

French researchers are developing an Ebola test that would give results in 15 minutes. The present test used to test for Ebola takes 24 hours. Faster tests are also being developed in Japan and the United States. A big medical team has been sent to West Africa by China.

Last week, the Wall Street Journal had a report about the online travel company Orbitz, which shows Mac users higher-priced travel choices at the top of search results than users of Windows. The company finds that people using Mac computers spend up to thirty percent more for hotels than people with PCs.

CAMERON YUILL: “Mac users tend to be richer than PC users, so why not target them with the messages that are going to correspond with them?”

Companies have always gathered information about their customers. But now they have a lot more ways to do it. Eric Martin is a partner at a management consulting company. He says the Internet has increased the amount of data that companies can collect.

ERIC MARTIN: “Technology is creating an environment where your searches and your online behavior lead the seller to know much more about you, which has an effect on how they view you as a customer and what your buying habits might be. The people you deal with online can’t see you at all physically. But they know that when you came to Orbitz you may have been directed there by Kayak, which is itself a comparison site, which then may lead Orbitz to believe that you’re searching for deals.”

Information about the referring site is only one of the things that a site like Orbitz will consider. Is the person a return visitor? Which hotels has this person viewed in the past? Websites collect this kind of information by placing small files known as cookies on a person’s computer.

In the case of Orbitz, Mac and PC users were actually given the same choices. However, they appeared in different orders. For Mac users, the higher-priced hotels showed up higher in the search results. Orbitz says ninety percent of its users book a hotel that appears on the first page, and mostly in the top five listings.

People with minor cases of frostbite that affect only the skin may not suffer any permanent damage. But if deeper tissue is affected, a person is likely to feel pain every time the area gets cold.

To avoid cold-related injuries, here is a simple way to remember four basic steps to staying warm. Think of COLD — C. O. L. D.

The O stands for over-effort. Avoid activities that will make you sweaty. Wet clothes and cold weather are a dangerous combination.

L is for layers(层). Wearing loose, lightweight clothes, one layer on top of another, is better than wearing a single heavy layer of clothing. Make sure outerwear is made of material that is water-resistant and tightly attached.

D is for dry. In other words, stay as dry as possible. Pay attention to the places where snow can enter clothing. These include the tops of boots, the necks of coats and the wrist areas of mittens or gloves.

And here are two other things to keep in mind — one for children and the other for adults. Eating snow might be fun but it lowers the body’s temperature. And drinking alcohol might make a person feel warm. But what it really does is weaken the body’s ability to hold heat.
